## Healthy Eating

## School Uniform



*School uniform is compulsory for all children that attend our school. Children are expected to arrive at school every day wearing the correct school uniform. The school uniform is as follows:*

- **Black/ grey school trousers or skirt/pinafore**
  - **Yellow polo shirt**
- **Green jumper or cardigan with/without school logo**
  - **Plain black school shoes (no trainers)**
    - **Dark Green PE shorts**
    - **White short sleeved PE t-shirt**
  - **Outside PE kit as an optional addition**
- **Green & white checked dress (as an option in summer)**
  - **Fleece (optional)**

## Attendance and Holidays in term time

Please make sure your child is in school every day unless they are unable to attend due to illness.

Headteachers are no longer allowed by law to authorise term-time holidays. This has been in place since September 2013. Parents will be fined by the local authority for taking children out of school during term-time to go on holiday.

**Please book your holidays during the school holidays to avoid being fined by the local authority. Oldham are now fining for holidays in term time.**

If school has been notified that a child is off due to illness when they are in fact away on holiday, and this comes to our attention, this will be regarded as an unauthorised absence and recorded as such.



## World Book Day

## School Gate Times/ Bike shed



The school day is as follows.

Nursery **8.45am – 11.45am**

Reception to Year 6 **8.45am – 3.15pm**

The gates will be open at 8.35am and **closed just before 8.45am** so that teaching can start **promptly at 8.45am.**

The gates will be open at **3.10pm and closed at 3.30pm.**

Breakfast club will continue to open from **8am** for all our families with children of Reception age and up, to access.

**The bike shed is open earlier for breakfast club students to access. We cannot take any bikes or scooters in through the main entrance – once the gates are locked after final bell at 8.45am they will not be reopened therefore if your child is late and comes on a scooter or bike unfortunately you would need to take it home with you.**
